- Individuals committed to reading and discussing a selected book, guided by the question: "How will this book influence my philosophy and professional practice in my classroom and teaching community?"

Why are they important?

A professional book club is important because they:

- Provide the chance to discuss teaching and learning with a group of peers on a topic of interest to them
- Help communities of educators maintain interest in contemporary issues, topics, programs, and educational theory and research.
- Offer educators a supportive environment to engage in risk-free, honest discussions that result in both personal and professional growth..

When are they useful?

Professional book clubs are used when

A group of educators wish to explore a topic in which they all share a common interest.
